During my stay in Broken Hill, I was able to teach at the kids' club, distribute tracts with others from Sydney who came to help as well, and preach for the church. All in all, it was a good, enjoyable time in which we were able to share the gospel with around 15-20 kids. A few of the kids were actually from Tasmania and there on holiday. It was good to be able to reach these kids even though their parents are not interested in church.

Youth Camp

In January, I was able to take **two teen boys** to summer youth camp.
