Bill's Testimony

I was born in San Diego, California. I grew up in several places in California due to my father's job relocations as a Federal Civil Service employee with the Department of the Navy.

My salvation by Jesus Christ occurred in 1973 after praying and asking Jesus to come into my heart as a five-year old boy. My parents were active members at the El Centro Baptist Tabernacle in El Centro, California where I first heard the gospel and responded to the conviction of the Holy Spirit of my need for salvation.

Later in life, while serving in the U.S. Army, I attended the Temple Baptist Church in Lacey, Washington, where I was baptized and called by Christ into full-time ministry.

Heather's Testimony

I was born in Tucson, Arizona. I grew up in Evergreen, Colorado. My family was active in the Home School Conferences. As a child, I had made a false profession of faith in Christ. Bill's Call to the Ministry

Christ called me to full-time ministry in 1987 while serving in the United States Army at Fort Lewis, Washington. I had been attending the Temple Baptist Church in Lacey, Washington.

While reading the Gospel of Luke one Saturday afternoon, I began reading chapter nine. Christ began convicting my heart. When I got to verse fifty-nine and sixty, God spoke to my mind and heart through these verses, and they became a directive from on high. Luke 9:59-60 reads as follows; "And he said unto another, **Follow me** [emphasis mine]. But he said, Lord, suffer me first to go and bury my father. Jesus said unto him, Let the dead bury their dead: but **go thou and preach the kingdom of God**" [emphasis mine]. It was as though God, Himself, was pointing directly at me saying "go and preach" right there in my barracks room. I consulted my pastor, and he agreed that Christ was calling me to the ministry.
