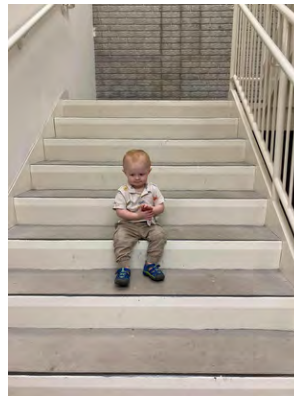
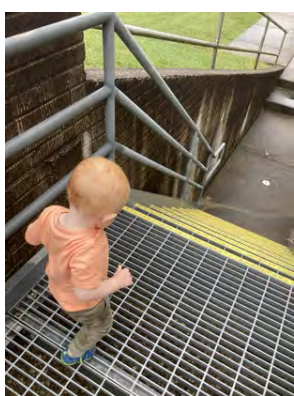
AUGUST AND SEPTEMBER UPDATE 2025 OVERVIEW
